Dear Steven,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report filed by the MIT Police regarding the night of November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. According to the report, the officer asked about the count of guests in attendance at the event and realized that Chi Phi had not counted members in attendance as part of the count. Along with this, the officer expressed concerns about minimizing noise when guests are departing from the event(s) at Chi Phi. Based on this information, Chi Phi may have violated the following policy from the MIT Mind and Hand Book and the FSILG Social Events Policy.

*MIT Mind and Hand Book*  
**II (6). Disorderly Conduct**

*FSILG Social Events Policy*  
**Social Events with Alcohol**

2. The maximum number of persons that maybe present in the fraternity house during an event with alcohol shall be the lesser of:
  - b. The total number of members of the fraternity present at the event PLUS two (2) guests per PartySafe trained member attending the event,

After reviewing your response, I have decided to resolve this case administratively. Based on the totality of the information available to me, I have found Chi Phi not responsible for violating the above policies. While there was some initial confusion about counting members for the attendance at the event, these issues were worked through with MIT Police and resolved at the time of the complaint.
