Dear Steven,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report filed by the MIT Police on the night of October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018. The incident involved alleged violations to the IFC Risk Management Policy, FSILG Social Events Policy, and Mind and Hand Book.

After reviewing the police report, Kappa Sigma's account of the incident, and a statement from Allied Security, which Kappa Sigma hired to assist with security, the Judicial Committee determined that this incident is covered by MIT's Good Samaritan Amnesty Policy. As a result, there will be no disciplinary sanctions for Kappa Sigma.

On the night in question, an underage woman was transported from in front of the Kappa Sigma house due to overconsumption of alcohol. The transport was called for by members of Kappa Sigma and Allied Security. The woman indicated that she had been drinking upstairs in the Kappa Sigma house before being transported.

Kappa Sigma made the right choice in calling for a transport. However, I encourage Kappa Sigma to take a serious look at the events that led up to this incident. Fraternities are responsible for what happens in their house during social events, including in member rooms. Kappa Sigma should work to ensure underage members and guests do not have access to alcohol in the house.
