Dear Terrance,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report submitted by the MIT Police regarding an incident on April 15th, 2018. The incident involved alleged violations of the FSILG Social Events Policy.

On the night in question, Phi Delta Theta did not shut down a registered social event until 5 minutes after the end time. This was a result of the president and risk manager losing track of time. Accordingly, based on the complaint, the IFC Judicial Committee finds Phi Delta Theta responsible for violating the following policy.

III. Social Event Gathering Provisions

C. Registration Process

- 1. All event registrations require the following information to receive approval:
 - Event end time.

This determination will not result in sanctions and will remain solely as a letter to file. The IFC Judicial Committee may consider this letter when deciding on future allegations against Phi Delta Theta within the timespan permitted in the Judicial Committee Bylaws. I also encourage you to shut down social events at least 15 minutes before the end time to ensure that all guest have time to leave before the registered end of the event.
