Dear Jamie,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report filed by MIT Police on the night of October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018. The incident involved alleged violations to the MIT Mind and Handbook.

On the night in question, officers arrived at Pi Lambda Phi following a noise complaint. The officers asked Pi Lambda Phi brothers to turn down the music and the brothers complied without incident. As a result, the IFC Judicial Committee finds Pi Lambda Phi responsible for the following violation:

## MIT Mind and Handbook

## II (6). Disorderly Conduct

MIT prohibits disorderly conduct. Disorderly conduct is defined as any unreasonable or reckless conduct by an individual or group that is inherently or potentially unsafe to other persons or to their real or personal property, and/or any behavior that disrupts the peace or interferes with the normal operation of the Institute or Institute-sponsored activities. Disorderly conduct includes making unreasonable noise, disrupting a lawful meeting, obstructing pedestrian or vehicle traffic, or creating a hazardous situation.

This determination will not result in sanctions and will remain solely as a letter to file. The IFC Judicial Committee may consider this letter when deciding on future allegations against Pi Lambda Phi within the timespan permitted in the Judicial Committee Bylaws. I encourage you to keep alcohol out of all public spaces when there is no registered social event to prevent a similar issue from happening again.
