Dear Connor,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of two reports filed by the MIT Police on the night of October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018. The incidents involved alleged violations to the IFC Risk Management Policy and FSILG Social Events Policy.

After reviewing the police reports and Sigma Chi's response to the incidents, the Judicial Committee determined that this incident is covered by MIT's Good Samaritan Amnesty Policy. As a result, there will be no disciplinary sanctions for Sigma Chi.

On the night in question, Sigma Chi called MIT police to assist with a crowd that had formed outside a registered social event. When police arrived, the crowd dispersed without issue. Later in the night, a Harvard student was transported by Harvard medical services due to overconsumption of alcohol. The transport was called for by members of Sigma Chi and the Harvard student's friends.

Sigma Chi made the right choice to call for MITPD assistance for dealing with the crowd, and later to call a transport for the intoxicated transport. The safety of members and guests was clearly a priority for members of Sigma Chi. However, I encourage you to take steps to prevent similar issues from happening in the future.
